St Peters Lutheran College is proudly hosting the RCJA Brisbane Regional competition this year. Students of all abilities are encouraged to attend. Private entries are also welcome.

New to RoboCup?

RoboCup Junior is a robotics competition for school students. You can enter one of three leagues within the competition – dance, rescue and soccer. Students usually enter the competition in small teams, and typically use Lego robotic kits such as the EV3 or NXT.

If your school is new to RoboCup, this competition may be a good opportunity to help you get started with robotics. If you do not wish to compete, but still want to see what RoboCup is all about, please just let us know. We're always keen to share robotics with new people!

Important Information	
Eligibility	Open to all primary and secondary students. Parents, teachers and friends are all welcome to come.
Leagues	Open to all dance, rescue and soccer. The competition format may be adapted depending of the number of entries. Divisions may be combined where there are few entries.
Date	Saturday 22 nd July 2017
Time	8:00am to 2:30pm <i>Registration and setup from 8:00am</i> <i>Competition rounds will run from 9:00am – 2:00pm</i>
Location	Theile Building (pronounced Tyler), St Peters Lutheran College, Harts Road, Indooroopilly, 4068
Parking	There is some parking on-site and ample parking in surrounding streets. If your school is travelling by bus, please indicate this on the registration form. Buses can drop students off at the on-campus bus stop and then park on College Drive.
Entry Fee	\$15 per student
Meals	Morning tea and lunch provided as part of the entry fee. Teachers/mentors will also be catered for. Those with allergies or dietary requirements should bring their own meal. BBQ and coffee van items available for purchase.

Media Release	All attendees, whether competing or not, may be photographed or filmed by the media, St Peters Lutheran College, or other individuals at the competition. Competition

The competition format may be shortened or adapted to accommodate the number of teams who have registered.

Teams do not have to complete a logbook or journal, although the referees may ask teams to explain their robot and program.

There will be space for teams to set up their equipment and work on their robots

- This workspace is limited, and large teams may not have a seat per person
- There may be limited access to power outlets
- Students should bring their own computers, tools and equipment

Dance

Students must bring a USB with their music along to the competition. The music file must be in MP3 format. It is recommended that you also bring a

backup copy. We cannot guarantee the ability to play other types of files.

Students will not be able to stream music or access YouTube.

Volunteers

If you are free to assist on the day, it would be much appreciated! Please let us know via email, or when you arrive.

Supervision

Although St Peters will manage the event, visiting schools must ensure they have enough staff to supervise their students. Students should not wander beyond the venue area.
