## Mighty Maisy Maze course markers

### Instructions:

- Print onto white card or thick paper.
- Print the pages with the Green and Red markers on a colour printer. You will probably want at least three copies of each.
- Print the Black page on a laser printer (if possible as it will use a lot of black ink), or use black paper or card. You will probably want one or two copies.
- Print (or just follow the instructions) to make a Silver page. Only one is needed.

## Mighty Maisy Maze course

### Notes:

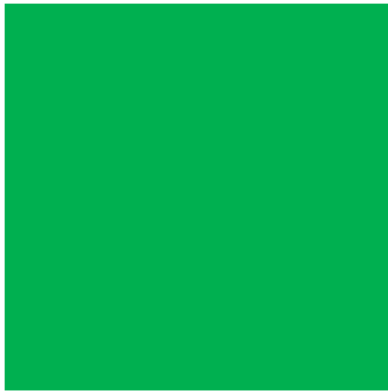
- The course should be laid out on a white or light coloured smooth hard surface.
- You can use reams of A4 paper laid on their long side to create the walls for a Mighty Maisy Maze course, or use the open maze walls.
- The course cannot have any freestanding internal “floating” walls.
- There is no debris, obstacles, stairs.
- The start and finish is the same location, being the Silver tile.
- There can be Black tiles, signifying a hole in the ground.
- There can be trapped victims (Green squares) and Injured victims (Red squares). There will be a minimum of 5 victims on a course.

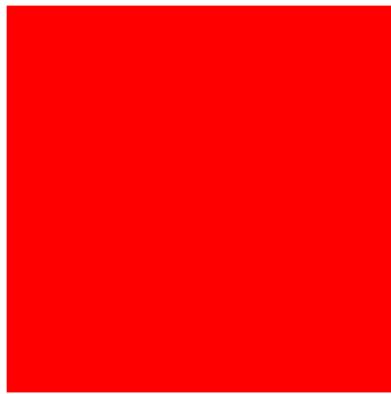
